- 2. Referring to morality in **two** short stories, discuss how each work defines goodness or badness. What makes characters, events or actions good, bad, both or neither? How do they help make each story's *dénouement* plausible? (20 points)
- 3. How does point of view affect the way **two** short stories are told? What does the reader benefit from or lose through each narrator's knowledge of what is happening in the plot? (20 points)
